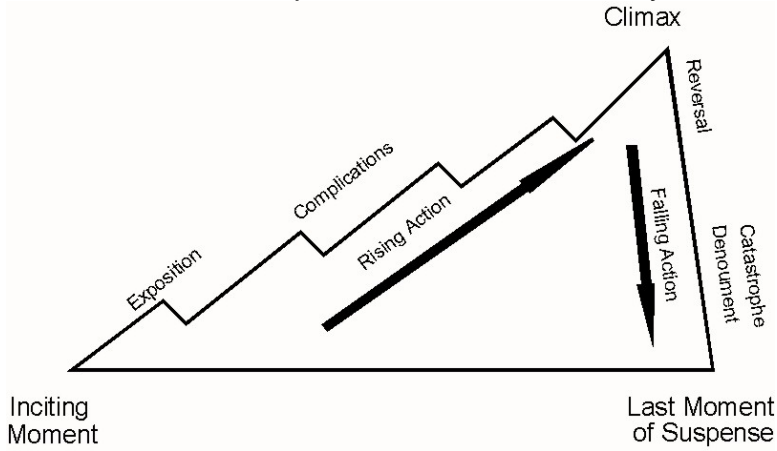

## ***The Plot Thickens***

The PLOT is the sequence of events in a story, movie or play.



Exposition/Background Information on the main characters

Rising Action (the main conflict)

The Climax (the most exciting part of the story)

The Resolution (how the conflict is resolved)

### ***Why Did That Happen?***

Events are related to a story and one thing **may** cause another to happen. Characters change a story because **they** often change and **affect** others. (For example, CAUSE: Rob dated Noreen behind Connie's back. EFFECT: Connie breaks up with Rob.)
