

DISTRICT 742 NUTRITIONAL SERVICES DRESS CODE POLICY

- 1. A clean uniform must be worn every day. The uniform consists of white slacks or skirt and a top. The uniform should be worn only to work. Our goal is to present a clean, professional, and well-groomed appearance at all times.**
- 2. Uniform slacks should be a loose style and made of woven, not stretch or knit, material. Leggings, stirrups, white jeans, or white stretch pants are not acceptable. Tight slacks are not professional looking and, therefore, not permitted.**
- 3. Do not wear patterned, colored, thong, or bikini style underclothing because it shows through white slacks and is very unprofessional looking.**
- 4. Polo Shirts should be made of a cotton or polyester material. T-shirts with inappropriate logos are not allowed. Polo Shirts should be long enough to cover the midsection. There should never be a gap of bare skin exposed when stretching, reaching, or lifting.**
- 5. Predominately leather, non-skid, and white, i.e. no two tone colored, shoes must be worn. An all white leather tennis shoe is permissible. Colored or two tone colored tennis shoes are not acceptable. Shoes must be kept clean and worn only at work. Canvas tennis shoes should not be worn.**
- 6. When serving, cotton or plastic disposable aprons must be clean.**
- 7. Be considerate when you wear perfume. Remember that you are working in close proximity and your co-workers may be sensitive to certain fragrances. In addition, perfume fragrances may clash with food aromas.**
- 8. YOU MAY BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE BUILDING AND RETURN IN PROPER ATTIRE, AT THE DISCRETION OF THE FIRST COOK, IF YOU ARE NOT FOLLOWING THIS DRESS CODE AS STIPULATED.**
