

Dismissal – all grades

Need A) poster with words and pictures 1) walk all the way down the hallway (walking feet) 2) stay to the right side of the hallway (arrow pointing right) 3) Watch out for other kids in the hallway (eye) 4) Be quiet. (shhh) B) recording (or live) of Denise calling buses C) bus number sign

Ready – Backpack on back

Pay attention and leave when directed

Use line basics

Responsible – Exit quietly

Go directly to Kid Stop, your bus or meet your ride

Follow adult directions

Respect – Get your things from the coat hook quietly

Clean up the coat hook area

Say good-bye to others

Today we're going to talk about the end of the school day. If you ride a bus home, the bus driver will get you home safely. That's their job. One of the jobs that the grown-ups at school have is to get you to the bus or wherever you are going after school safely. Your job is to be ready, responsible and respectful from the time school is over until you get off the bus at home. I'm going to teach you how to get to the bus safely at Lincoln.

Ms. _____ at the end of the day, what will you tell the students to do to get ready to go home? Get belongings from the hallway.

When it's warm outside, you'll probably just go get your backpack. When it gets colder, what else will you need? coat, hat, mittens and boots.

When you get your backpack all ready, where does it go? You need to put it on your back and keep it there until you sit down on the bus, get in your car, or you get to Kid Stop.

When you have a coat what do you need to do with? put it on and fasten it

I think I've got it! What do you think? Demonstration: coat half on, backpack open and dragging down the hallway.

Volunteer: shows coat on, backpack closed and on back.

Now, you need to LISTEN and LOOK!

Who knows what 'dismissed' means? That's a big word that means you can go now.

Here's what you'll hear:

Play audio recording: *"Students who are going to Kid Stop may be dismissed at this time."*

If you are going to Kid Stop after school, you can go there now. How do you get there?

Walk all the way down the hallway.
Stay near the right side of the hallway.
Watch out for other kids in the hallway.
Be quiet.

Here's what you'll hear next:

"Students riding buses 23 and 10 may line up at this time."

When you hear your bus number, you need to get in line.

Where's the line? Primary- near the office Intermediate – at the end of this hallway

How do you get there?

Walk all the way down the hallway.

Stay near the right side of the hallway.

Watch out for other kids in the hallway.

Be quiet.

Where do you line up? In front of the grown-up holding up your bus number. Show sign.

What if there are other kids already in line? Do you budge in front of them or push them away to get in line? You make the line longer!

Then you have to LISTEN and LOOK again!

The grown-up will say something like, "OK, bus 23. Let's go!"

What do you do? You need to watch the grown-up or the kid in front of you and walk slowly out the door.

What about these doors? What about these cool buttons that open the doors? What about the door closing?

Put your hand up as you go by so the door doesn't hit you in the face if it starts to close.

If the door starts to close, you can lightly tap the button to get it to open again.

How many kids need to tap the button?

What could happen if every kid hit the button maybe more than once as they walk out the door?

Can someone show me what a tap on the button looks like? Volunteer demonstrates.

Now you're outside – yippee! Now it's time to run, right? Stay behind the grown-up.

What about this red line? What's that for?

That line keeps you safe so the drivers can see you and so the end of the bus doesn't hit you when it pulls away.

Which side of the red line has more space to walk?

That's the side that you need to walk on until you get to your bus.

If you get picked up or walk home from school, after all of the buses have been called you'll hear:

"Students who are walking or being picked up may be dismissed at this time."

Where do you go?

How do you get there?

Walk all the way down the hallway.

Stay near the right side of the hallway.

Watch out for other kids in the hallway.

Be quiet.

Look for the person who is picking you up near the office or walk slowly out of the building and head home.
